Summer Day Camp

Entering Kindergarten to 7th Grade ■ 9:00am - 4:00pm

Each day at our Summer Day Camp, campers and staff will play, laugh, learn, and create a memorable summer! Camper's daily schedule involves a variety of age-appropriate activities including group games, sports, arts and crafts, STEM experiments, team building challenges, and more opportunities to try new activities. Water play days, special events, theme days, field trips and special guests, and group challenges round out the weekly schedule.

Campers are separated into groups by grade. Under the guidance of our experienced staff, campers will grow their social skills and self-confidence, foster relationships with their peers, learn the importance of teamwork and cooperation, and gain their own independence.

BITS UNIT Entering KG & 1st Grade

The BITS Unit introduces our youngest campers to the excitement of camp. Campers enjoy a mix of camp activities, designed to ensure a developmentally appropriate camp experience for our youngest campers. With a 5 to 1 camper to counselor ratio, the BITS Unit offers a close-knit camp environment for campers to try new things and foster relationships with counselors and their peers.

BENNY UNITEntering 2nd & 3rd Grade

Welcoming our "middle" campers to camp, the BENNY Unit expands campers' daily schedule to include more high-energy, enriching activities designed to suit their growing interests. BENNY Unit activities are developed to encourage teamwork and cooperation. A 10 to 1 camper to counselor ratio offers a supportive camp environment for campers to grow socially and emotionally.

BENNY Unit campers will go on a weekly field trip.

ALSO UNIT Entering 4th to 7th Grade

Designed for our oldest campers, the ALSO Unit enhances campers' experience through adventure-based, mind stimulating activities.

ALSO Unit campers will have the opportunity to take ownership of their camp experience through activity choice periods. A 10 to 1 camper to counselor ratio offers a supportive camp environment to nurture self-confidence and independence.

ALSO Unit campers will go on a weekly field trip.

Counselor-in-Training (CIT) Program

Entering 8th to 10th Grade ■ 9:00am - 4:00pm

The first step in the Teen Leadership Program, the CIT Program is designed to give hands-on training to teens who are looking to be future camp counselors and leaders in the community. CITs will participate in activities designed to expand their leadership skills including problem solving, communication, positive role modeling, and more. CITs daily schedule combines classroom learning sessions, fun teambuilding challenges, and group assignments. By working directly alongside counselors during group assignments, teens further develop the skills necessary to work with younger children and their peers. The CIT program is broken up into two, one-week sections, "A" and "B". Sections can be taken in any order. Both sections must be completed before being awarded a Certificate. Those individuals who have completed both Sections "A" & "B" of the CIT Program may register for the Jr. Staff Program. Completion of the CIT Program does not guarantee future employment. 15 participants/week

Jr. Staff Program

Entering 8th to 10th Grade ■ 9:00am - 4:00pm

Designed to be the next step in the Teen Leadership Program, the Jr. Staff Program provides on-the-job training to participants to expand their camp counselor and leadership experience. Jr. Staff will spend the majority of their day assigned to one camp group, with the purpose of supporting our summer camp staff in daily operations, camper supervision, and programming. Jr. Staff will also be involved in planning and running group activities, mentoring CITs, and more. Jr. Staff will be subject to evaluations during the camp season in order to gain valuable feedback and guidance to grow their leadership skills. Participants must have completed the CIT Program and be recommended for the program by the Teen Leadership Coordinator. Jr. Staff registrants may sign up for any amount of weeks. Completion of the Jr. Staff Program does not guarantee future employment. 15 participants/week





Our dedicated staff team is what makes our Summer Day Camp an exciting place for our campers. Our experienced staff are current and former EDP staff, high school students, and college/ post college students. Many staff return to our camp each summer. Staff are assigned to each group and maintain the required staff-to-child ratios in their assigned groups.

Before the summer begins, our staff:

- Undergo a comprehensive interview process as well as reference and background checks.
- Attend a mandatory staff training covering topics including behavior management, supervision, child abuse prevention, problem solving and conflict resolution, emergency policies and procedures, and more.
- Become certified in basic First Aid and CPR (Head Counselors)

Summer Enrichment Programs provide hands-on learning experiences for children to grow, explore, and discover new interests beyond the classroom. Class sizes are kept small to ensure quality instruction in a safe and interactive manner.



We'll end the week with a local field trip and picnic to the Lake Chauncy Trails to further our naturalist know-how. Come explore with us - Adventure awaits!

GRADES

Grade ranges represent the grade that your child will be entering in Fall 2024. Your child may be withdrawn from a program if they do not meet the grade requirements. Non-residents of Westborough are welcome to attend.

REGISTRATION FEE

The annual registration fee is \$25.00 per family, per year. There is no registration fee for enrichment programs.

PROGRAM REGISTRATION

Registration for all programs is on a first-come, first served basis.

- SUMMER DAY CAMP Online registration must be completed along with a \$275.00 non-refundable deposit, per family. The deposit is deductible from the camp tuition. Please complete one registration per child. Full payment is due by May 31st, 2024. Programs registered for after June 1st require full payment due at the time of registration. No child will be permitted to attend camp unless tuition has been paid in full.
- <u>SUMMER ENRICHMENT & TEEN LEADERSHIP</u> Online registration and full payment due at time of registration.

PAYMENT POLICY

You become obligated to submit payment when you register for a program. Please submit payment through your SchoolCareWorks Family Portal (Tuition Express). Fees applicable to Tuition Express.

WAITLIST

Once a program has reached its maximum enrollment, we begin a waitlist for that specific program. If an opening becomes available, families will be contacted in the order in which they were added to the waitlist. Waitlists are monitored regularly.

OUTSTANDING ACCOUNT BALANCE

Any outstanding balance owed to Westborough Community Education must be paid in full before a participant can attend any program run through Community Education.

ENRICHMENT REGISTRATION DEADLINE

The registration deadline for any Community Education enrichment program is two-weeks before the start date of the program. Registrations will not be accepted after that date. Enrichment programs will only run if we have received the requisite number of minimum registrations.

PROGRAM CANCELLATIONS AND CHANGES

All programs are offered pending sufficient enrollment and are subject to cancellation at the discretion of Westborough Community Education. We reserve the right to cancel programs that are under enrolled, and to change the times, locations, and instructors when necessary.

PARTICIPANT WITHDRAWALS AND CREDITS / REFUNDS

Email withdrawal requests to WCE@westboroughk12.org during business hours (Monday – Friday, 9:00am – 4:00pm). Requests that come outside of those hours will be considered the following business day.

Westborough Community Education will issue a full refund or account credit when a program is canceled. Refund requests must be submitted in writing 14 days from the cancellation notification. Refund requests that are received after the 14 days will not be accepted, and an account credit will remain in place. If you had withdrawn from the program prior to the program cancellation, you are ineligible to receive a full refund.

Participants who arrive late, depart early, miss days, or are dismissed from the program due to behavior are not granted prorated tuition, refunds, or credits.

For the Summer Day Camp, if you withdraw from a program on or before May 31st, you will receive an account credit for the full amount, minus the \$275.00 non-refundable deposit. In lieu of a credit, you may request a check; however, you will only receive 75% of the total amount. If you withdraw on or after June 1st, neither an account credit nor a refund will be issued.

For Summer Enrichment Programs and Teen Leadership Programs, if you withdraw from a program on or before May 31st, you will receive an account credit for the full amount. HEALTH RECORD

Each participant must have a health record, including immunizations, on file with the Westborough Community Education office. A copy of these records must be obtained from your child's physician and given to the Community Ed office two weeks prior to your child starting any summer program. The health record must be from within the past 18 months.

EMERGENCY MEDICATIONS

If your child requires any emergency medication (epi-pen, inhaler, etc.), it is the parent's responsibility to provide the medication and authorization form by the first day of the program. Please contact our offices about the appropriate authorization form.

LICENSING

Our summer programs are licensed by the Westborough Board of Health. All policies and procedures for the Summer Day Camp are on file with the Board of Health and are available upon request. Parents of campers have the right to review background check, health care, discipline policies and grievance procedures upon request of the Summer Day Camp. This camp must comply with the regulations of the Massachusetts Department of Public Health (140.190c) and be licensed by the local board of health. Additionally, we are recognized by the Commonwealth of Massachusetts Division of Unemployment Assistance as a Seasonal Employer for our summer programs.
